### **National Aboriginal Veterans Day-November 8**

Did you know that November 8 is a day of remembrance celebrated in Canada in recognition of the contributions of Indigenous peoples to military service, especially during the First and Second World Wars and the Korean War.

The day was first commemorated in 1994. The special memorial was created because prior to 1994, Indigenous veterans were not recognized in Remembrance Day activities. Aboriginal veterans had to overcoming many obstacles to serve Canada in

these wars, including adapting to new cultures, sometimes learning to speak new languages (usually English), and traveling long distances to enroll. Everyone is therefore encouraged to proudly wear a beaded poppy in their honor, which can be purchased on several websites by Abo-

riginal artists and in Aboriginal boutiques.

It is with regret that the Native Alliance of Quebec announced the passing of our former President Grand Chief, Robert Bertrand, who left us from this physical world on May 17, 2022. Robert, who is a native of Fort-Coulonge in the Pontiac, worked for several years within the NAQ before being elected National Chief at the Congress of Aboriginal Peoples of Canada.

During his mandate, he was a major contributor to the Supreme Court of Canada's decision in the Daniels case and also generated the Political Accord that flowed from that decision.

His knowledge, experiences and passions have greatly benefited us. Thank you for everything and now rest in peace.

We are saddened to announce the death of Mr. Jacques Périard on June 15, 2022, following a long battle with illness.

Mr. Périard was responsible for the community's housing committee for over 25 years.
