You are invited to our popular Solstice celebration again this year, and we will be putting even more emphasis on our children. I look forward to connecting with you.

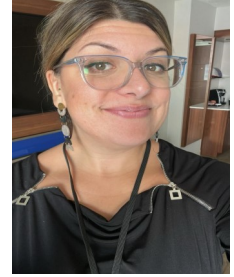

## NEW MEMBER TO THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS—COMMUNICATIONS

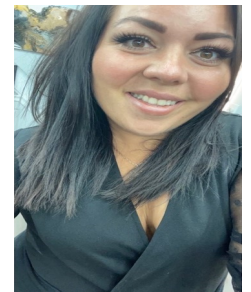

**Community member profile involved in our community**

The accompaniment makes you grow !

Following my retirement and the loss of several family members, I wanted to demystify the end of life. So, in January 2024, I started my 12-module course (36 hours) that prepares us to support people in palliative and end-of-life care.

Yes, Albatros is a movement that has existed in Quebec for 44 years, which started in Trois-Rivières and is present in 14 regions of Quebec, and for more than 11 years in the Outaouais. The objective is to accompany, free of charge, 3 hours/week or more, the person in palliative and end-of-life care and also to give a break to caregivers.

If you or your loved ones are diagnosed with a serious illness leading to palliative and end-of-life care, Albatros is there to support you at home, in the hospital, in a CHSLD, in a seniors' residence or even in the Palliative Care Home.

Albatros Gatineau La Lièvre serves the greater Outaouais region from Pontiac to Lachute. Yes, each accompaniment is unique, special and very rewarding.
